JR. HIGH COURSE CHANGEOVER

Some of our complementary courses for our Jr. High students have now concluded. January 31 signifies the transition point from the first to the second semester. During the first week of February, final marks for Semester 1 complementary courses will appear on *connectEd*. Courses that have concluded will have a Term 1 mark and a Final mark. Complementary courses that are full-year offerings will not have a Final mark but will instead have a Term 2 mark reported prior to spring break and then a Final mark in June. One change of note in our complementary course offering will be the introduction of 'MindUP' which will be offered for one period each week to all of our students in Grades 8 & 9. Mrs. Arlie Bouchard (Family School Liaison Worker) and Mr. McMullen will be facilitating the course. An introduction for the course can be found in the 'FSLW UPDATE' section.

PARENT and STUDENT ANNUAL SCHOOL SURVEY

As an annual check-up on the education system, the Accountability Pillar provides an opportunity for Alberta Education and school authorities to ensure that we are equipping students for success.

The Accountability Pillar uses a set of 16 indicators. Data on these indicators consists of surveys of students, parents and teachers on various aspects of education quality, student outcomes such as dropout and high school completion rates, and provincial assessments of student learning.

From January to the end of February, Alberta Education will be conducting the annual Accountability Pillar Survey. Every year, Alberta Education surveys parents of students in grades 4, 7 and 10. Therefore, in January, parents of students in grade 7 at École Mother D'Youville School will receive a survey from Alberta Education. In February, students in grades 5 - 9 and all teachers will be completing their surveys online at school.

All surveys are anonymous and ask questions about experiences with your school. Your participation in the survey helps provide important information on the quality of education your child is receiving, so we encourage you to return your survey promptly.

Survey results will be available to school authorities in May 2018, and will be reported publicly as part of our 3-Year Education Plan and Annual Education Results Report. Thank you again for your feedback.

ASH WEDNESDAY - VALENTINE'S DAY

Did you know that for the first time since 1945, Valentine's Day and Ash Wednesday will fall on the same day? This will mean that the festivities usually associated with Valentine's Day at the school will see some changes.

Ash Wednesday is a somber occasion that marks the beginning of the 40-day period of Lent. On this day, Christians attend services and receive ashes upon their forehead, usually with the words "Remember that you are dust, and to dust you shall return"; alternatively, the priest may speak the words, "Repent and believe in the Gospel."

The ashes serve as a powerful symbol demonstrating the wearers admittance of their failings and are a visible symbol of penance. As well, the ashes, along with the words spoken by the priest, remind us of our mortality, humble our hearts, and emphasize our need for Christ in our lives.

The tone set on Ash Wednesday is meant to stay with us throughout the season of Lent. Lent is a specific time built into the church year that calls us to simplify our lives. It is a time to leave behind the frivolities and distractions of our day to day lives and focus ourselves on our relationship with God. It is a time of penance and self-examination. Consequently, the tone of Ash Wednesday and Lent does not harmonize with the festivities usually associated with Valentine's Day, particularly how it is often celebrated in the school setting.


What *does* match the feel of Valentine's Day is Shrove Tuesday. Shrove Tuesday, also referred to as Mardi Gras, or Pancake Tuesday, is often associated with celebrations and indulging in food that one will not partake in over the next 40 days. It is the complementary nature of these two days that makes Shrove Tuesday the logical alternative day to hold Valentine's Day celebrations!

FSLW UPDATES

Games Room - Lunchtime Club

"Play is the highest form of research" -Albert Einstein

Once a week each grade has the opportunity to take part in game room. This lunchtime program fosters and encourages social interaction between peers in a safe environment while having fun experiencing new and old board games. Research has indicated undirected play allows children to learn how to work in groups, to share, to negotiate, to resolve conflicts, and to learn self-advocacy skills. During this time, students are asked to focus and celebrate positive events in their week. This program has been a great success in its first few weeks and has an 80-100% occupancy each day. The students have certainly created a culture of fun and play during this time. I would like to send out



a special thanks to several students in Grade 8 who have offered their time during Games Room as peer mentors.

MindUP CURRICULUM - Grade 8 and 9

We are excited to announce that École Mother D'Youville School will be offering a comprehensive, classroom tested, evidence based program called MindUP. Young people today are no strangers to stress. Whatever the circumstances, the stress they experience could interfere with their ability to learn without anxiety. MindUP addresses obstacles to productive learning by offering self-management tools, while at the same time MindUP works to make learning joyful and fun.

The MindUP classroom is a positive and optimistic environment that promotes and develops attention and awareness of oneself and others. Students will learn about their brain and how it functions and in the process they will gain insight into their own mind and behaviours as well as those of the people around them. Students will participate in a curriculum that will help them develop self-regulation and focus, an improved ability to work well with others and improve relationships with themselves, and with the community. Research has shown that students who are engaged in the MindUP program are more optimistic, empathetic, compassionate and have lower levels of stress and anxiety.

GROUPS

During the months of February to April there will be several groups offered to students at the school. They include:

<u>Starbound</u> A small group curriculum that will help girls jump-start their journey to unleashing their unlimited potential. Girls will learn to develop healthy relationships, enhance their communication skills and discover that they can make a positive difference in the world.

<u>Building Champions</u> A fun-filled game plan to help boys of upper elementary and middle-school age build trust, respect, and peer connections, Building Champions covers the topics boys most want and need to become better

friends, classmates, and citizens. Numerous hands-on and interactive experiences maintain group members' interest and allow them to practice targeted skills while learning.

<u>Building Blocks of Teamwork</u> This is a collaborative play group in which children work together to build LEGO models. Instead of building LEGO by themselves, Children work in teams of three. The task is divided into different roles, such that social interaction is necessary to participate. By doing this, children practice key skills of collaboration, joint attention, fair division of labour, sharing, turn taking, eye contact, gaze following, verbal and non-verbal communication. Group sessions facilitate natural opportunities to practice social communication, social support, social problem-solving and conflict resolution skills.

Boys Council A small social - emotional group designed to empower boys to identify and manage their feelings; understand and accept difference; learn about boundaries and how to set their own personal boundaries; practice group social skills; and identify their own male positive supports in their lives.

<u>Kids Have Stress Too</u> The goal of the program is to help students understand stress and its impact on health and learning. The program teaches students practical techniques for coping with stress and how to address the signs of stress before they get overwhelmed by them.
