#### **TEXTBOOKS AND LOCKERS/LOCKS**

#### Textbooks

Textbooks are assigned to each student as required and are theirs to use for the duration of the course. Students are to return the textbooks at the end of the assigned term in an undamaged condition. Lost textbooks are the responsibility of the student they are assigned to.

In the event that text books and library books are damaged the following fees will be charged to the student.

Torn/Missing pages – \$10.00 Graffiti – \$10.00 Damaged cover – \$10.00 Missing Barcode – \$ 5.00 Broken Spine – \$20.00 Lost/Destroyed – Replacement cost

These penalty fees are assigned in June upon return of student textbooks.

#### Lockers & Locks

Students are responsible for the condition and accessibility of their lock/locker at all times. Students are expected to treat the lock/locker with respect and keep their combination confidential.

The rental cost of locks will be sent via School Cash Online at a cost of \$10.00. Replacement cost of an additional \$10.00 for lost/damaged lock will be added as required. Students can also bring in their own combination locks from home; they must provide the combination to our front office staff.

Re: VTRA - Letter of Fair Notice

#### Dear Parents/Guardians:

The STAR Catholic School Division is committed to providing safe and caring learning environments for all students, staff, school visitors and community members. To this end, we have invested heavily in the professional certification of administrative staff in Level 1 & Level 2 Violence and Threat Risk Assessment (VTRA) training across the Division. VTRA helps schools respond quickly to incidents where students' behaviours pose a potential threat to safety or serious harm.

In all six of our school Division's communities we have signed off on formalized community-based VTRA protocols that include other regional partners such as the public school jurisdictions, the RCMP, Alberta Health Services, and other community agencies. Such protocols outline how organizations will collaborate and work together to respond quickly to threatening behavior. These protocols are modeled on the work of the Canadian Centre for Threat Assessment Trauma Response.

Please be advised that the school division requires school administrators to complete a threat risk assessment in cases of students making significant threats to themselves or others. The purpose of the assessment is to ascertain the potential level of risk posed and identify supports that may be required. It is important for all parties to engage in the threat risk assessment process. If, for some reason, there is a reluctance to participate in the process by the threat-maker or parents and guardians, the assessment procedures will continue in order to ensure a safe and caring learning environment. Personal information shared throughout the threat risk assessment process respects and weighs individual rights to privacy with the need to uphold the safety of all.

Re: Important notice regarding vaccinations in St. Thomas Aquinas Roman Catholic Schools

Dear Parents and Guardians of Grade 9 Students:

I am writing to advise you regarding the matter of vaccinations within the STAR Catholic School Division.

At its regular Board meeting of May 21, 2014 the Board passed *Policy 21: Vaccinations*, which is attached herewith for your reference.

You are receiving a copy of this letter and policy because your child is scheduled to participate in the school-based vaccination program for the upcoming year.

As per Board Policy 21 please note that there are different consent processes for different vaccines. Accordingly, the consent process for administration of vaccines will be as follows:

- Alberta Health Services (AHS) will be in direct communication with parents and guardians
  regarding information and consent for the <u>HPV vaccine</u>. Consent for the HPV vaccine is
  facilitated directly between AHS and parents/guardians, and consent forms are not to be sent to
  the school.
- For all <u>other vaccines</u>, the distribution and collection of consent forms may be facilitated at the school level, meaning these consent forms can be returned to the school.

Please note that AHS will be mailing you shortly with further information.

Should you have any questions about AHS's in-school immunization program please contact your local public health centre.
