## CONFIRMATION 2021 Requirements

1) ASSIGNED READINGS:

The Confirmation student workbook, with all the assigned readings, is called **"Decision Point"** and is published by Dynamic Catholic. It can be picked up at the parish office when you drop off the registration forms with a cheque for \$40.00.

## Letter to the Bishop

You are free to respond to God's call to live your faith more deeply – to worship, witness and serve as a confirmed Catholic Christian. If you wish to receive the Sacrament of Confirmation, write a formal letter of request to Bishop Greg Bittman, stating your desire to be confirmed. Follow these guidelines:

### **GREETING**

Begin your letter with the greeting: Your Excellency, Dear Bishop Greg Bittman ...

### **BODY OF THE LETTER**

<u>Paragraph 1</u>: Introduce yourself. Say something about your family or your background.

<u>Paragraph 2</u>: Request the sacrament. Give several reasons why you would like to be confirmed.

<u>Paragraph 3</u>: Explain how you have prepared for the sacrament. It is important that you tell about specific parts of your preparation: your prayer life, your celebration of the other sacraments, your service hours done at home, in the community and in the parish, etc.

<u>Paragraph 4</u>: Tell how you will continue to carry out your life of service to God and others through the power of the Holy Spirit. Tell how you plan to make your Confirmation in the Faith real and alive in your life.

### CONCLUSION

Conclude the letter and write your complete signature.





### ROLE OF THE SPONSOR

- Must belong to the Catholic Church, be 16 years of age or older and be fully initiated themselves having received Baptism, Eucharist and Confirmation, and regularly participate in the sacraments.
- Will support the candidate being confirmed in their commitment to a Catholic life.
- Know the candidate and be willing to serve as a strong and long lasting Catholic influence on the candidate.
- May be either male or female for any candidate.
- May be the baptismal Godparent, thus emphasizing more clearly the relationship between Baptism and Confirmation.
- May not be the Parents of the candidate. The sponsor is supposed to be an additional support, just like a Godparent at Baptism.
- Will encourage the candidate by forming a relationship based on their shared faith.
- Presents the candidate to the Bishop at Confirmation, if unable to do so a Proxy may fill in.
