4.4 Local Priorities for the Board

The board has asked each School Council to further discuss Board Priorities as they pertain to their local region. Some ideas we came up with are:

5.0 NEW BUSINESS

- 5.1 Grateful Advocates for Catholic Education Update (GrACE)
- GrACE has existed in Alberta since 2018. It was created by the Bishops of Alberta, the Alberta Catholic School
 Trustees and the Council for Catholic School Superintendents. GrACE aims to unite, engage, educate and
 communicate with one voice on behalf of Catholic education. Each Catholic school district has been asked to
 form a GrACE team composed of the Superintendent, Trustee, Staff, parishioners and parents.
- These teams were formed to advocate for Catholic education against current issues of:
 - Respect for and affirmation of Catholic Schools
 - Catholic schools are constitutionally protected and have been educating children in Alberta for 160 years
 - Catholic school are unique and distinct and share a Catholic worldview that is foundational to who we are
 - Catholic schools welcome all
 - Catholic schools educate both Catholic and non-Catholic students.
 - Amalgamation Argument
 - There has been no peer reviewed study that has indicated any money would be saved by amalgamating public and Catholic schools. Many people make the assumption that students currently in a Catholic school would switch to a Private (paid for by the family) school if Catholic Education was amalgamated. In reality the 184,000 students are not going away but instead would end up in the public system as well meaning that taxpayers would not see a difference in their contribution.
- As supporters of Catholic education, I ask you to take a look at your property taxes and see where your school
 contribution goes. If you didn't specify when you purchased your home it will automatically default to public
