We recognize the diversity of First Nations who have at one time, lived across the territory, as well as the presence of the Metis Nation."

#### 4.0 Old Business

- 4.1 Catholic High School in Beaumont
  - The board will continue to advocate for a Catholic High School in Beaumont. Land has been approved for a dual high school (public and Catholic), but the government has not yet approved the build of any high school. The land also still needs to be serviced. The land is east of the new ball diamonds. Currently there is only a single gravel road leading to it. (notes from September meeting)
  - Our local School Trustee will start advocacy for the school next month when the legislature re-opens. (notes from October meeting)
  - Jeanie reports that she read in the Beaumont Community report that it is in the budget for this year to add services to the area where the school will eventually go

#### 5.0 NEW BUSINESS

- 5.2 Paint night with St. Andre
  - We are able to get the same grant money this year that we got last year in order to host something like the paint night again. St. Andre has reached out to say they are interested in running a joint event again. Would we like to do this again? And do we want to do a paint night or something different? St. Andre is open to suggestions.
  - We decided that yes, we are open to a joint night. We talked about when and decided on April. For the where: we will host it here. Some ideas we talked about were painting a plant pot and then potting a plant in it on the way outside.
  - St. Andre has requested that we do it in May again as that is when we did it last year. Are we able to pick a few possible dates and send it to them so we can settle on a date?
  - We talked about some more ideas today but decided we liked our plant pot painting. Plant pots were about \$25.99 for 20. At this price point, we could pay for pots, paint and some dirt and plants.
  - Supplies: 100 people max. Paint, pots, brushes, paper plates for palettes, dirt and plants. We'll give St. Andre plants and dirt and we'll organize the rest. Possible dates: Wednesday May 8th Thursday, May 9th (before Mother's Day), Thursday May 23rd.
  - Karla has talked to Renee at St. Andre and they have agreed to the supplies purchase split and will get back to us on a date.
  - They chose May 23rd. 6pm to 8pm. We bumped the number up to 120 painters. Jordan will send out a google sign up (so we have numbers for painters and parents just attending but not painting). The sign up will go out one month before. Karla will share this info with St. Andre.
  - School pays for the supplies and then it gets coded back to the district to access the grant.

Field Testing Program Fun Facts - Did you know:

Field tests are one way to reduce test anxiety? "Test anxiety is reduced when a student feels adequately prepared for a test ... Of all the strategies for reducing test anxiety, the surest and most effective is when a student possesses a justifiable confidence that he or she has, prior to testing, achieved mastery of whatever content or skills a test will cover

... Preparation for taking a test should include familiarity with the parameters of the test ... It is important to familiarize students with what the test will actually look like, how long it will be, how many questions it will have, what topics will be covered, how much time will be permitted" (Cizek and Burg, p. 97) and so on. Field tests are great for providing students with that familiarity, boosting their confidence and letting students, and teachers, know what areas of study require more attention.
